PHILHEALTH CONCLUDES SUCCESSFUL SERVICE MISSION TO THE KINGDOM OF BAHRAIN

The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth), in cooperation with the Philippine Embassy in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain, conducted a service mission to the Kingdom of Bahrain from 29 June to 01 July 2017.

The successful service mission was held at the Embassy premises, where the PhilHealth Team composed of Team Leader Renato Limsiaco, Jr., PhilHealth Regional Vice President for Region VIII, and Data Controllers Mr. Ronaldo C. Bernabe and Mr. Humphrey S. Lubang, provided the following services:

1. Printed 800 pieces of PhilHealth ID Cards;
2. Distributed 400 pieces PhilHealth Members Records Form (PMRF);
3. Generated 97 Member Data Records (MDR);
4. Made 158 PhilHealth membership data amendments;
5. Distributed 400 PhilHealth OFP Business cards;
6. Distributed with discussion 400 pieces PhilHealth Flyers for OFWs;
7. Distributed 100 pieces Z benefit packages flyers; and
8. Distributed 300 pieces of the List of PhilHealth Accredited Collecting Agents (ACAs) in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

The PhilHealth Team also provided services during the Filipino community event entitled “*Gabi ng Talento at Musika*” held on 29 June 2017 at the Bahrain Keraleeya Samajam Hall in Manama, and met with Filipino Community leaders at the Embassy premises on 30 June 2017.
